AAUW September 24, 2015, Branch Meeting Minutes

SOCIAL-DINNER HOUR 5:30-6:30 P.M.: President Helgeland announced a request by an NDSU professor for volunteers to be interviewed by students for a class project. The study is about women's lives in the 1950's, '60's and '70's. Several members agreed to be contacted.

A membership information sheet was circulated to gain more details about each person's educational and professional background in an effort to use the potential expertise of each person in Branch activities.

<u>MEETING 6:30 P.M.:</u> President Susan Helgeland called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Ruth Stefonwicz introduced and welcomed new member Deborah Dubrovolny.

The meeting's agenda was approved. Pat Schutt moved and Alexa Duchioame seconded that the May meeting minutes be approved. Motion carried.

Finance Officer Lisa Rorvig distributed copies of the proposed budget and the September treasurer's report. Ruth Stefonowicz moved and Liz Cambron seconded that the budget be approved. Motion carried. The treasurer's report showed a balance on hand of \$630.06. The report will be filed for audit.

President Helgeland announced the Board approval of the application by the Branch for a Tech Savvy grant from AAUW for a workshop for 7th grade girls in places. Liz explained the addition of selling member-donated art at the sale, for which the receipts will be retained in the Branch treasury.

President Helgeland asked for a volunteer to do the monthly newsletter in the absence of Beth Anderson who is hospitalized.

PROGRAM 7:15 P.M.: Susan Helgeland introduced the speaker, Deb White, MSUM Professor in the Sociology Department and Coordinator of the Tri-College Leadership Institute.

Ms. White in her program titled "Tri-College New Leadership Development: History, Mission and Current Status" reported that 500 women have participated in the twelve institutes in the region since 2004.

The annual five day leadership institutes encourage civic and political participation, provide leadership training and support, and recruit women from under-represented groups. There is no charge for the 40 participants, and scholarships are available for childcare and travel. Tangible skills such as public speaking, running for office, fundraising, grant writing, media skills, and public policy advocacy are taught in workshops.

Ms. White illustrated the need for leadership training by showing statistics on the vast under-representation of women in the world in number of females in lower houses of government. The U.S. is 76th with 19.4%. In the region Minnesota has 33% females in the state house, 4th in the nation, but North Dakota has only 19%, 38th in the U.S.

Ms. White concluded by mentioning the success of some of the graduates of the institutes and encouraging members to be applicants or volunteers.

<u>ANNOUNCEMENTS:</u> President Helgeland announced Liz Cambron has been appointed as the NDSU Campus Connection.

Pat Schutt announced a Planned Parenthood meeting in St. Paul on October 22.

Jocie Iszler announced the "Style Like a Child" event at the Fargo Theatre on September 26 sponsored by the North Dakota Women's Network.

The October Branch meeting will be held on October 12 at the Fry'n Pan with the program focused on AAUW's mission and goals and their implementation both nationally and locally.

The meeting was adjourned.


