### **December 14. 2015 Branch meeting minutes**

Present 12 members, 1 guest, 1 speaker

Sara Lindberg, secretary, called the meeting to order.

The minutes of the November meeting were approved.

Finance Officer Lisa Rorvig presented the finance and the book sale reports.

The Finance report was approved.

Maureen Kelly Jonason moved and Bobbe Shreve seconded that the Branch donate \$350 to the New Leadership event held in June. The motion carried.

Lisa announced an Executive Committee decision to discontinue offering honoraria to program speakers beginning in the fall of 2016. She also asked for volunteers to serve with her on a fundraising committee. Lisa collected donations to the Legal Advocacy Fund for both North Dakota and Minnesota.

Sara Lindberg reported that the Executive Committee approved the formation of a committee to identify Title IX coordinators in area schools and distribute the Title IX Manual to them. Liz Cambron and Ruth Stefonowicz will join Sara on this committee, to begin meeting in January.

A brief discussion was held on choosing a date for next year's book sale. The Moorhead Center Mall director contacted the book sale committee to put the sale on their calendar. The decision on the date will be made by the book sale chair.

Alexa Ducioame reported on the STEM event co-sponsored by AAUW on January 7, 2016, from 9:30 to 3:00 at NDSU. All of the fund raising is complete and AAUW's logo will be on the banners and the goody bags given to the participants. 175 students are expected; Alexa asked for volunteers to welcome the students and to fill the bags for distribution.

Alexa reminded us that in January AAUW membership dues will be half price.

Maureen Kelly Jonason reported that the bylaws committee met and reviewed the 2015 national bylaws and made any changes necessary to conform with that document. A draft of the revised branch bylaws will be ready for voting in May.

Lisa passed a reservation signup for the January 9 Brunch at the Radisson at 10 a.m. with Moorhead Mayor Del Rae Williams as the speaker.

The meeting was adjourned.

Lisa Rorvig introduced the program speaker, Erin Prochnow, Executive Director of The YWCA Cass Clay.

Erin began by thanking AAUW for its support of the YWCA and mentioned the similarities of its mission in education initiatives to AAUW's. She briefly described the YWCA's history, which began in 1906, with dormitories for women and children. Currently the emergency shelter in Fargo is the largest one in North Dakota and Northwest Minnesota, providing temporary residence for about 70 women and children escaping violence and homelessness. There are also 32 additional supportive housing units, programming for children at the shelter and a nationally accredited public childcare facility in north Fargo for 85-90 children.

Erin reported that 92% of women seek shelter due to violence or chronic homelessness, often due to mental illness or PTSD. A nurse partnered with Sanford provides services 30 hours a week. The usual length of stay in the emergency shelter is 45 days, after which a move to supportive housing can occur, with the average stay of two years. Over 90% of the supportive housing residents are independent when they leave.

The education/employment program for YWCA clients begins with efforts to increase self-confidence and aims at the ultimate goal of employment. Due to the needs of the women involved, shorter training programs have been implemented in cooperation with NDSCS Technical Skills and Training School.

Erin also discussed the efforts made to aid children in their school environments.

The YWCA is a member of the Red River Region Human Trafficking Task Force, which is helping an increasing number of victims, both adult and youth, especially in the Fargo area.

Erin's comprehensive overview of the YWCA's programs, and her energetic and compassionate concern for the women and children rescued by the organization, were appreciated by all. She collected the items Branch members donated to fill some of the needs of the shelter residents.
