On Tuesday, November 12<sup>th</sup>, Bethany Reinhardt will be presenting on Challenges for Women in the Workplace and will cover the top 5 challenges, what leaders can do, and what you can do. Note that we're moving the event to Tuesday instead of Monday, which is Veteran's Day. We're moving to the 5<sup>th</sup> floor of Renaissance Hall to a room with more regular chairs instead of the stools we had in September. Our book club will be reading *The Line Becomes a River: Dispatches from the Border* by Francisco Cantu and meeting on Monday, November 25<sup>th</sup>. NPR and The Washington Post named this a 'top 10 book of 2018'. Cantu was a Border Patrolman for 4 years in the SW desert, tracking those attempting to enter the U.S. He delivered people to detention, brought in the dead, and became aware of the violence on both sides of the border. A Fulbright fellow, he has won numerous awards, has written for several magazines, and was featured on This American Life. He coordinates the SW writing program at the University of Arizona. Because this issue is so timely, Cantu, a Mexican American and grandson of a Mexican immigrant has had an unusually stimulating book tour, with protests at some of his appearances. Join us for a unique and empathic perspective on border security and immigration.

On March 3, 2020, Minnesota will hold a presidential nomination primary to vote for each major party's nominee for president. Early voting begins January 17, 2020. Voters can register online at the Minnesota Secretary of State's Office <u>https://www.sos.state.mn.us/elections-voting/register-to-vote/</u> or register at the polls.

The University of Minnesota Humphrey's School on Women, Gender and Public Policy has issued the 2019 Status of Older Women in Minnesota. Topics covered in the 16-page report include: safe and affordable housing, mobility and transportation, healthcare and wellbeing, giving and receiving care, financial wellbeing and stability. Many of these issues are directly related to AAUW's strategic focus of economic security.

Highlight of the report related to pay equity: "Security in old age is built on a lifetime of economic and social security or insecurity, so that the wage and wealth gap, the caregiving penalty, disproportionate gender-based violence and historical trauma based on race, ethnicity, LGBTQ identity, or geography accumulate."

"Without earned income, most older women must rely on accumulated wealth, including home equity, as they age. Home ownership disparities for women of color and American Indian women contribute to greater economic instability and vulnerability."

## **100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Women's Suffrage**

John Harris, Prairie Public Television, interviewed her about the 100th anniversary of Women's Suffrage and what the museum at the Hjemkomst is doing in the coming year to mark the anniversary. ### Meet STEM Advocate Kristina Halona

We were proud to see <u>AAUW 2008 Selected Professions Fellow</u> <u>Kristina Halona</u> highlighted by Wogrammer, an organization that supports women in STEM. Halona, a longtime advocate for native women in STEM, is a program manager of the Antares Systems Engineering Group with Northrop Grumman. Antares is a rocket whose mission is to take cargo to the astronauts living at the International Space Station. Halona says her matriarchal Navajo culture helped prepare her for her career.



### **Mentorship Matters**

Helping smart girls become successful women is central to AAUW's mission. The nonprofit <u>Women of Tomorrow</u> is doing that by pairing accomplished professional women with at-risk girls selected by partner public schools. We loved learning more about Women of Tomorrow from 2019-20 AAUW Community Action Grantee Colleen Lockwood on our recent <u>#AAUWAsks Twitter chat</u>. The Broward-County-based organization plans to partner with AAUW's Fort Lauderdale, NOVA Southeastern University, Pompano Beach and Weston chapters.

## **From the AAUW Archives**

Jane Addams, a founding member of the Chicago AAUW Branch, was an activist, reformer, social worker, suffragette, pacifist, and promoter of women's suffrage and world peace.

Born in 1860, the youngest of eight children, she contracted tuberculosis of the spine at age 4, which caused life-long health problems and difficulty walking. She attended the Rockford Female Academy, graduated Phi Beta Kappa in 1881, and spent a year in medical school before ill health forced her to withdraw.

Ms. Addams founded Hull House in Chicago in 1889, a residence for women to research and study various subjects such as midwifery, fatigue, typhoid, garbage collection, cocaine and truancy. The organization provided medical treatment for poor families, night school for adults, clubs for children, a public kitchen, gym, library, music school, art gallery and employment bureau.

She was an advocate for juvenile court laws, the eight-hour working day for women, and workers compensation, all with the goal of improving society. She nominated Theodore Roosevelt for President for the Progressive Party in 1912.

The first American woman to receive the Nobel Prize for Peace, Addams lived up to her motto: "Action indeed is the sole medium of expression for ethics."




